Secrets of the Balanced Literacy Club: Apps Included!

The prospect of teaching students with moderate to significant disabilities to read and write may seem daunting. The Balanced Literacy Project includes: kickoff presentation, short monthly presentations including make-it projects, in-class modeling and coaching, and team celebration of successes. Clubs have spanned multiple school districts and 90+ classrooms, and include a range of students (with cognitive impairments, autism spectrum disorders, physical impairments, and those using AAC devices). The presentation will share: assessment ideas, videos, data, specific strategies for three parts of balanced literacy (word study, guided reading, and self-selected reading), plus tips for getting EVERYONE onboard and excited about pushing for quality, research-based literacy. For each area, we will discuss our Top Ten Apps, plus ideas for how to USE those apps interactively. There will be a strong focus on ideas for replicating this project.

Participants will receive a CD with multiple forms for setting up your own club, and sample intervention templates.

iWRITE!! Supporting Emergent to Conventional Writing through the iPad!!

Helping students with disabilities grow as writers is all about Time, Teaching and Technology! Learn how to use your iPads to support text production from scribbling to invented spelling and simple sentences to persuasive essays. We will go beyond using symbols / words / phrases, produced traditionally or with technology, to impact writing with the alphabet. The full writing process will be explored, covering prewriting, drafting, revising, editing, and publishing, including specific strategies for struggling students at each phase (e.g., using T.I.E—Topic / Ideas / Ending to develop a paragraph) and using fun apps at each stage (e.g., apps to support idea generation and to celebrate the final written product). Student writing samples (pre- and post-) will be shared and participants will engage in brainstorming activities to customize materials for their students and curriculum. A key focus throughout the day will be using apps to inspire writing for students who use a range of ‘pencils,’ from traditional writing tools and computers to alternate pencils such as light tech alphabet flipboards and onscreen keyboards.

Caroline Ramsey Musselwhite, Ed.D., CCC/SLP has more than 30 years of experience working with children and adolescents with severe disabilities. Her “how-to” books include *Emergent Literacy Success*, *Communication Programming for Persons with Severe Handicaps*, and *Reading Activities Project for Older Students (R.A.P.S.)*. She is also the author of software programs (*Write to Talk*, *Social Scripts*) and books (*Learning to Work*, *Literacy Starters*) for youth with disabilities. She has presented thousands of workshops throughout the world, and is a founding member of the Board of Directors for the International Society for Augmentative and Alternative Communication (ISAAC).

Audience: Speech-language pathologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, special education teachers, assistive technology specialists, paraprofessionals, parents.

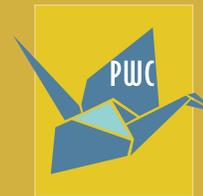

The Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks recognizes that communication is an essential component of every child's education.

For some children, the use of augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) and other assistive technologies (AT) can help them express themselves and engage in activities that might otherwise be nearly impossible. Recently updated state guidelines for preparation of special education teachers acknowledge the importance of AAC/AT in general and special education settings for helping students who are nonverbal or have limited speech to achieve their potential.
